Hall County School District GOALS:

- 1. By the end of FY25, the percentage of students in each subgroup moving into the "Proficient" and Distinguished" levels of performance on the Georgia Milestones Assessments will increase by 2% in the "Proficient" and "Distinguished" levels of performance.
- 2. By the end of FY25, increase the percentage of referred students who access school based mental health services in order to increase the overall school climate rating for HCSD by 1%.

Friendship Elementary GOALS:

- 1. By the end of FY 2025, the percentage of students scoring in the 40th percentile or higher on the ELA MAP Growth reports, in kindergarten through fifth grade, will increase by 2%.
- 2. By the end of FY 2025, the percentage of students scoring in the 40th percentile or higher on the Math MAP Growth reports, in kindergarten through fifth grade, will increase by 2%.

Friendship Elementary will:

- Provide curriculum nights for parents to assist in understanding and supporting the curriculum and standards their child is learning at each respective grade level.
- Provide parents an opportunity to participate in literacy-focused events.

- Communicate school news and updates through the Falcon Flyer, school website, and Social Media.
- Offer parent conferences either in person, over the phone, or via Zoom to fully explain grade level expectations and students' current level of progress and strategies to increase student achievement in math and literacy.
- Provide parents with frequent reports on their children's progress via the Tuesday Folder.

PARENT RESPONSIBILITIES:

We, as parents, will:

- Read with my child every day.
- Visit the Hall County's Big Ideas website utilizing parent resources that include instructional videos and questions to ask my child in an effort to check reading and math fluency.
- Encourage my child to utilize the digital resources posted on the school website to practice and improve upon his/her academic skills.
- Read materials in Tuesday Folders each week along with the Digital Falcon Flyer that is sent via Remind.
- Utilize tips from the parent workshops to help my child at home.

STUDENT RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Use the Hall County's Big Ideas website linked from the school website to practice and improve my reading and math fluency.
- Log-in on the canvas course created by the teacher for daily assignments as well as the digital resources link posted on the school website to access the fun games and activities provided to build academic skills.
- Practice my math fluency and problem solving each night.
- Read books with my parents for at least 20 minutes each night.
